At year-end 2021, there were 449 sentenced adult prisoners per 100,000 adult U.S. residents (p. 14, Table 6), or 0.449% of the U.S. adult population, which means that 99.551% of the U.S. adult population were *not*sentenced prisoners. (Sentenced prisoners are those sentenced to more than one year.) The total number of prisoners was 3.5% higher than the number of sentenced prisoners, as there were 1,204,322 total prisoners (p. 6, Table 1) and 1,163,665 sentenced prisoners (p. 10, Table 3) (1,204,322 ÷ 1,163,665 = 1.035).
